As some of you know, the SCADA program is a competition that takes place in 36 countries on all six continents – from Australia & Austria to Sweden & Singapore.

It was established in 1959 by the American Dental Association and DENTSPLY International to establish a program which would stimulate interest in dental research on the part of dental students and educators and would also serve to introduce dental students to the benefits of membership in the ADA. This program has now had over 5000 students participating in these programs since 1959, and we continue to honour those top Canadian Students who compete each year and is now in its 43rd year of awards in Canada.

To be a part of the 2013 CDA/DENTSPLY Student Clinician Research Program competition, each of our top universities select their top $3^{rd}-4^{th}$ year student to represent their school annually. With this the CDA / DENTSPLY recognize each of these individuals with a plaque that is personally engraved with their names, and we are proud to have our TM's attend their Universities awards

It is these top 10 Canadian Students that will then go on to bring forward their contributions to dental research in what has now become a well recognised and highly anticipated event, and for 2013 was just held at the ODA/ASM.




